## BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

June 20, 2024

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. via Microsoft Teams.

1. Roll Call

The following Trustees were present via Microsoft Teams: Trustee Goddard.

The following Trustees were present in person: Mayor Jones, Trustee Thompson, Trustee Pakanati, Trustee Hodge, and Trustee Cockrell.

Trustee Schultz was absent.

A quorum was present.

2. Audience Participation

None

3. Consent Agenda

Mayor Jones moved to approve the Consent Agenda, with a second from Trustee Thompson. The motion passed unanimously.

- 4. For Possible Action
  - a. First Reading: Ordinance 2024-01 An Ordinance Amending Article 4 of Chapter 11 of the Town of Foxfield Municipal Code by the Addition Thereto of a New Section 11-4-130

Mayor Jones explained that this ordinance was drafted to clarify the responsibilities between the Town and homeowners as it relates to trees in the right-of-way. After discussion, the vote was deferred to allow for further edits.

## 5. Reports

- a. Members of Town Board
  - i. Mayor Jones commented on the complaints about signs in the right-ofway. Staff will contact one of the vendors mentioned to educate them on the Town code. Mayor Jones provided an update on July Fourth restrictions regarding allowable food.
  - ii. Trustee Thompson reported that Clean-up Day is set for June 22<sup>nd</sup>.
    Trustees Thompson and Hodge will also be doing preliminary playground digging with Xcel on site. Lastly, Trustee Thompson noted that while

airport-noise complaints are at an all time high, there has been some mitigation through the work of committees.

- iii. Trustee Cockrell has been in communication with Ray Winn at Arapahoe County regarding the Easter Trail study. The IGA is expected to be done in the third quarter, with 2025 funding to follow.
- b. Staff
  - i. Town Administrator Proctor
    - The job opening for the Town Clerk has been posted to multiple sites. Ms. Proctor has six interviews already setup. Additionally, former Clerk Randi Gallivan has offered to help on a limited basis, and current Clerk Kathleen Schmitz will continue to help with Treasurer and Accessibility duties on a limited basis.
    - 2. The Town culvert work is on hold until SEH can speak to Terracare and clarify their proposal.
    - 3. The Foxfield Sign is broken again, and it will be moved to prevent ongoing damage.
    - 4. Lastly, Ms. Proctor asked for Land Use comments.
  - ii. Town Clerk Schmitz reported on the following:
    - The Town has passed the 2024 CIRSA audit. The CIRSA representative noted that they will review the playground next year. While the representative did not have any findings, he did suggest fixing the leaning bollard at the Richfield gate and refreshing the protective coating around the base of the metal posts at the gates to prevent further rust.
    - 2. Ms. Schmitz reported that she has received complaints about prairie dogs.
    - 3. Ms. Schmitz has begun a procedure document to help with the training and transition of a new clerk.
    - 4. The accessibility audit has been completed and a follow-up call will take place next week. Town Clerk Schmitz noted that she will work on the critical issues first, followed by serious issues with high risk.

## DISCUSSION:

Attached for discussion is Ordinance 2024-01. This ordinance adds a new section 11-4-130 to chapter 11 of the Municipal Code to clarify responsibilities for trees in the Town rights-of-way.

Based on the Board's discussion at the last meeting, subsection (a) has been removed because vegetation located in the Town rights-of-way is addressed in municipal code section 7-1-20(7)(c)(2). In addition, the word "maintenance" has been removed and clarification was made to state that the Town is responsible for trimming or removal of trees in the rights-of-way that are deemed to be a hazard.

## A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 11 OF THE TOWN OF FOXFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE BY THE ADDITION THERETO OF A NEW SECTION 11-4-130

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF FOXFIELD, COLORADO:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Town of Foxfield Municipal Code is amended by the addition thereto of a new Section 11-4-130 to read as follows:

### Sec. 11-4-130. Tress in Town Rights-of-Way

The Town shall be responsible for the removal or trimming of trees located in the Town rights-of-way that are deemed to be a hazard. Provided however, nothing in this section shall be deemed to preclude a property owner from removing a tree located in the Town right-of-way adjacent to such property owner's property. Such property owner shall obtain a right-of-way permit pursuant to Section 11-4-20 to remove such a tree.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Town Board of Trustees hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police powers of the Town of Foxfield, that it is promulgated for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare.

## A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 11 OF THE TOWN OF FOXFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE BY THE ADDITION THERETO OF A NEW SECTION 11-4-130

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF FOXFIELD, COLORADO:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Town of Foxfield Municipal Code is amended by the addition thereto of a new Section 11-4-130 to read as follows:

### Sec. 11-4-130. Trees in Rights-of-Way maintenance.

(a) Except as set forth in subsection (b) of this Section 11-4-130, all improvements, native grasses and landscaping located in the Town right of way and authorized by this Article 4 of Chapter 11 shall be maintained by property owner adjacent to said rights-of-way.

(b) The Town shall be responsible for the maintenance, care and removal or trimming of trees located in the Town rights-of-way that are deemed to be a hazard. Provided however, nNothing in this subsection (b) shall be deemed to preclude a property owner from removing a tree located in the Town right-of-way adjacent to such property owner's property. Such property owner shall obtain a right-of-way permit pursuant to Section 11-4-20 to remove such a tree.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Town Board of Trustees hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police powers of the Town of Foxfield, that it is promulgated for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare.
