BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES

September 4, 2025

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:36 p.m. via Microsoft Teams.

- 1. Pledge of Allegiance
- 2. Roll Call

The following Trustees were present in person: Mayor Jones, Trustee Thompson, Trustee Cockrell, Trustee Hodge, Trustee Lawrence, Trustee Pakanati, and Trustee Schultz.

A quorum was present.

- 3. Audience Participation None
- 4. Consent Agenda
 - a. Mayor Jones moved to approve the Consent Agenda, with a second from Trustee Schultz. The motion passed unanimously.
- 5. For Possible Action

Ordinance 2025-01 A Bill for an Ordinance Amending Chapter 7 of the Town of Foxfield Municipal Code Prohibiting the Advertisement of Short-Term Rentals in the Town – FIRST READING

Mayor Jones informed the board about the requirements that VRBO and Airbnb have and why this ordinance is necessary.

- 6. For Discussion
 - b. Intergovernmental Agreement for the Easter Trail Study
 Trustee Cockrell gave the board a summary of her last meeting with the County,
 where funds are coming from, and what has changed. Trustee Cockrell informed the
 board of likely factors that could determine the Town's portion of the project, the
 objective of the study, total likely cost of the study, what was being agreed to in the
 IGA, and that the expense for this study had been in the budget for many years.
 Discussion included possible placements of the crossing and trail at different
 locations with different types of signals and crossing configurations. Mayor Jones
 asked about the possibility of finding none of the options for the pedestrian crossing
 viable. Trustee Cockrell explained the high probability of one of the options being

viable. Trustee Thompson mentioned concerns from other residents regarding trail locations, issues with the open space, and transient people. Trustees deliberated on moving forward with this project due to cost, liability, interest use, increased pedestrian and vehicle traffic, and past endeavors for this type of project. Trustees agreed to not ask for a bus stop and to have a Foxfield only Town Hall meeting to gauge interest on this from the community.

Public comment – John Hallin mentioned that it sounded like the group was reaching the right conclusion and that a study would be necessary to determine what options are viable to present to the community.

Trustee Lawrence wanted to clarify if the board will know the project estimate and what portion of that would correspond to Foxfield. Trustee Cockrell mentioned that she can emphasize to the engineer that the board really wants to know about costs and different funding options.

Mayor Jones moved to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement for the Easter Trail Study. Seconded by Trustee Hodge. 5 yes and 2 No. Passed by majority.

7. Reports

- a. Members of Town Board
 - i. Mayor Jones asked if staff had found the owner of the light pole that is knocked down and staff mentioned they are working on it.
 - ii. Trustee Thompson informed the board about some incidents that recently occurred in Town. She inquired if there was anything the Town could do and discussion was held on the code, enforcement, and the Town's responsibility.
 - iii. Trustee Lawrence mentioned the benefits of being a Firewise community.He also shared the proposed programming schedule for the gates in2026. Trustees discussed what holidays and days should be included. y.
 - iv. Trustee Shultz said work done on bump at Richfield and Arapahoe was well done.
 - v. Trustee Hodge stated that gate violations have been going up. Ms. Proctor said that while there is an uptick right now, overall, they are down. Trustee Pakanati mentioned the importance of knowing the root cause and if it was repeat offenders. Trustee Thompson inquired on how many gate violations are outstanding. Trustees acknowledged a poor recuperation rate for fines and discussed further measures. Trustees decided to table this for another meeting as Ms. Proctor would like to look at the information previously discussed on this matter.

DISCUSSION:

Attached for approval is Ordinance 2025-01. This ordinance amends article 6 of Chapter 7 of the Foxfield Municipal Code to add Sec 7-6-10 titled "Short Term Rental Advertising" to authorize the Town to prohibit the advertisement of short-term rentals in Foxfield. Town Attorney Hoffmann has advised that adding this section to the Foxfield municipal code will aid in any future STR homes that may arise, as Airbnb and VRBO have stated that with this section in our code, they will be able to remove listings at the request of the Town.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE TOWN OF FOXFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE PROHIBITING THE ADVERTISEMENT OF SHORT-TERM RENTALS IN THE TOWN

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF FOXFIELD, COLORADO:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Town of Foxfield Municipal Code is amended by the addition thereto of a new Article 6 to Chapter 7 to read as follows:

ARTICLE 6

Short Term Rental Advertising

Sec. 7-6-10. Short Term Rental Advertising.

Consistent with Section 16-2-50(b)(4) of this Foxfield Municipal Code, a vacation rental service shall remove any listing for a short-term rental property in the Town from its platform after notification by the Town. The vacation rental service shall remove the listing within seven (7) days of receiving notification from the Town. For purposes of this Section 7-6-10, a *vacation rental service* is defined as a person or entity that operates a website or any other digital platform that provides a means through which an owner or owner's agent may offer a property, or portion thereof, for short-term rentals, and from which the person financially benefits.

Section 2. The Town Board of Trustees hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police powers of the Town of Foxfield, that it is promulgated for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare.

<u>Section 3</u>. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction invalid, such judgment shall not affect application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after final publication.

DISCUSSION:

Below is a chart of gate fine collections by year since the cameras were installed.

Some reasons for uncollectable fines, other than non-payment, include letters returned as undeliverable, resident tag not working (not fined in 2022), rental vehicles, out of state vehicles, and no results found for license plate.

In 2025, there have been multiple violations by the same vehicle, causing an increase in the total dollar amount of fines. Four vehicles had second violations (\$300) and one vehicle had a third violation (\$350). None of these fines have been paid.

Not included in this chart are when the gates were broken by motor bikes (7 in 2024 and 1 in 2025), vehicles with no plates or plates that could not be seen in the camera footage and therefore no fines were issued.

What can the Town do to collect unpaid fines?

Municipal court

Involves an attorney, cost for legal fees makes it cost prohibitive.

Small Claims Court

Involves an attorney to initiate litigation, resulting in legal fees and making this also cost prohibitive.

There is a limit on the number of claims you can bring in small claims court – no more than 2 a month and no more than 18 in a calendar year.

It is possible that the fine is still not paid, and the Town would have to proceed to collections (use agency).

Liens

To place a lien on a property in Arapahoe County, Colorado, you must obtain a judgment first, then file a Transcript of Judgment with the court and take it to the Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder's Office for recording.

For a Lien Based on a Court Judgment (e.g., Small Claims Court):

- 1. Obtain a Judgment: You must first get a judgment from a court, such as Small Claims Court.
- 2. Complete the Transcript of Judgment: Fill out the Transcript of Judgment form provided by the court that issued the judgment.
- 3. File with the Court: File the completed form with the court and pay the required filing fee.
- 4. Receive the Transcript: The court clerk will then issue the Transcript of Judgment to you.
- 5. Record with the Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder: Take the official Transcript of Judgment to the Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder's Office to officially record the lien on the debtor's property.

This process is also cost prohibitive.

Sheriff

Discussions were held with the Arapahoe County Sheriff's department in 2021 regarding the issuance of tickets for gate violations. The Sheriff stated that a picture of the driver would be needed to prove who caused the damage. Our cameras do not often capture an image of the driver, so this was not further pursued.

However, in some cases the cameras do capture images of the drivers, such as when the driver gets out of the vehicle and breaks the gate or moves the gate that they broke. We could look

into this further as a possible option to collect additional fines by having the Sheriff issue a ticket when we have images of the drivers.
