### **Mayor Jones update on SB23-123**

At the April 6th meeting, the Board unanimously passed resolution 2023-05 which opposes Senate Bill 23-213 as proposed by the Polis administration. Although this Bill will not currently impact Foxfield since our population is less than 1000 residents, we are concerned that this sweeping legislation would pre-empt local control over our community if and when our population exceeds 1000. It will also impact our neighboring communities creating higher density, increased traffic and an increased drain on services.

The Town of Foxfield was incorporated in 1994 to preserve our rural quality of life. The Master Plan is a document providing guidance with planning, land use and development. The vision of the Master Plan is to maintain for the residents of the Town the quality of life which has been and is currently enjoyed by its citizenry. These qualiites include, but are not limited to: low density housing, rural character of roadways, rural relaxed atmosphere, coupled with close in proximity to metro Denver. Our Land Use goal is to allow only land uses in the community which are compatible with a well-cared for rural, low-density character.

## HOW WILL THIS BILL POTENTIALLY IMPACT FOXFIELD:

- A detached Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) will be permitted on any single-family lot as a use by right. The ADU can be up to 50% of the size of the original structure with a minimum setback of 5' from the property line.
- Middle housing will be allowed as a use by right allowing single structures with up to 4 dwelling units in an area equal to 30% of singlefamily acreage.
- Removes all restrictions on the number of unrelated people living in a household.
- Lifts all parking requirements for multi family units.

The Town of Foxfield has worked hard to maintain our rural atmosphere despite the growing urban sprawl which surrounds us. This Bill will forever change the character of so many communities. More importantly, it removes local control from those that know their communities needs and puts them in the in the hands of the State. Again, this Bill will not currently impact Foxfield, but it could. DRCOG, Colorado Municipal League, Metro Mayors Caucus and most municipalities have opposed the Bill as presented. The Bill has been advanced to the Senate Appropriations Committee with amendments.

#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT**

As we begin to transition into the warmer times of the year, we would like to remind everyone of some common Code Enforcement violations and ask that everyone do their part in keeping our community beautiful as well as safe.

Listed below are some of the most common violations of the Municipal Code:

#### 7-1-20(7)(c): Noxious Weeds

Municipal Code requires that all noxious (aggressively invasive) weed growth must be properly removed or controlled to prevent the overgrowth into other properties. Not only is this aesthetically appealing, it reduces potential fire hazards as well as unwanted animals hiding out in the weeds. Please keep in mind that since this has been such a major issue in Town, you will only be given one courtesy notice. If the property is still in violation past the timeframe given, a summons will be issued.

#### 7-1-20(7)(a)(3)(b): Illegal or Inoperable Vehicles

All vehicles must be fully operable (meaning it starts, stops, runs and drives as it should), and legal (current license plates and etc.). Vehicles that are inoperable or illegal may be stored within a closed structure or garage. Covering the vehicle, or trying to conceal the expiration date, is not allowed and is still an enforceable violation.

#### 7-1-20(7)(a)(3)(d): Outdoor Storage of Vehicles

A total of 10 vehicles may be stored on the property in public sight, and they all must be legal and operable. This quantity also includes campers, trailers, etc. Anything over this limit must be stored in a garage/enclosed structure or properly screened from view, or removed.

#### 7-1-20(7)(a)(2): Outdoor Storage of Blight (Junk)

This applies not only to trash, but includes discarded appliances, discarded furniture, automotive parts/tools, construction materials/tools (unless an active building permit exists), piles of scraps, etc. Such items should be properly stored in a fully enclosed structure/garage, or completely screened from public view.

#### 7-1-20(7)(c)(3)(a)(b): Dead/Dying Trees

Dead or diseased trees need to be properly removed. They pose not only a fire hazard but also safety hazards should a decayed branch fall onto an adjacent property or street. 11-4-110(b) Culvert Maintenance In order to maintain proper drainage flow it is very important to ensure that all culverts at your property are clear of obstructions (grass, etc.), are not damaged, and allow for smooth water flow.

#### **Noxious Weeds**

List A: Rare noxious weeds that are subject to eradication wherever detected statewide in order to protect neighboring lands and the state as a whole.

List B: Noxious weed species with discrete statewide distributions that are subject to eradication, containment or suppression in portions of the State designated by the Commissioner in order to stop the continued spread of these species.

List C: Widespread and well-established noxious weed species for which control is recommended but not required by the State, although local governing bodies may require management..

The Town of Foxfield utilizes the TextMyGov platform to as a community communication tool. Citizens can use smart mobile devices to find information, report issues and receive Town notifications\*.

#### How to receive alerts:

Text the following phrases to 91896:

- To receive all Town communication alerts text the phrase Foxfieldgeneral. There is no need to sign up for any other alerts if this option is chosen.
- To only receive emergency alerts text the phrase Foxfieldalert.
- To only receive event related information text the phrase Foxfieldevents
- To only receive gate related information text the phrase Foxfieldgates
- To only receive meeting related information text the phrase Foxfieldmeeting
- After the initial keyword is sent, you will receive a confirmation message asking you to reply YES to verify opt-in.

#### How to find information or report issues:

Reporting issues send a text to 720-262-2265 and use one of the key words:

- Animal complaint key word examples: Dog, animal, animals, horse
- Code Violation key word examples: Tall grass, weeds, junk, building, code, noise
- Gate Issue key word examples: Violations, broken, hit, off
- Roadway Issues key word examples: snow, snowplow, plow, sign, debris

#### Helpful gate information

The Foxfield gates were installed as a traffic control mechanism to help limit the excessive cut through traffic in the Town of Foxfield. Residents play an important role in helping keep the gates operational and effective.

#### Below are some guidelines that will help mitigate any issues.

#### Tags:

To receive a tag please ensure the following steps have been completed.

- Payment of \$8.00 per resident tag has been made either online at https://www.colorado.gov/payment/townoffoxfield or send a check to PO Box 461450 Foxfield, CO 80046.
- Vehicle registration details sent to clerk@townoffoxfield.com

For replacement tags, please email the vehicle make/year/license number

For new vehicles with temporary tags, please email make/year

#### To report a gate issue:

- Text the word gate to 720-262-2265.
- Call 303-680-1544
- Email to clerk@townoffoxfield.com

#### Protocol:

- Tailgating is not allowed, and in fact, the arms are timed for one vehicle. In order to avoid damaging the gate arms, please do not attempt or encourage tailgating.
- Please do not manually try to raise or move the gate arms. Manually moving the arms will cause the arms not to work, and the arms will have to be reset by a trained team member.
- Please ensure all delivery teams know about the gates and use alternative routes during the hours the gates are in operation (M-F 6am-9am and 4pm to 7pm).
- Gate tags must be affixed to the windshield, if they are not the tags may not function properly.

#### FAQ:

#### What do I do if I see another car unable to get through the gates?

- If the vehicle has a gate tag please report the gate issues.
- If the vehicle does not have a gate tag, then they must use the turnarounds and find another non-gated exit on Arapahoe Road. There is a QR code on the new gate signs that provides a map of the area.

#### Can I use the keypad?

• No. The keypad is for emergency vehicles only.

#### 2023 Town of Foxfield Budget

A copy of the 2023 adopted budget can be found on the Town of Foxfield's website at https://townoffoxfield.colorado.gov/government/financial-reports.

The Town of Foxfield has three major funds: The General Fund, the Open Space Fund and the Conservation Trust Fund. In addition, in 2021 the Town added two small funds, a Road Maintenance Fund and the American Rescue Plan Fund.

The General Fund is the major operating fund of the Town and is used to account for all financial activities that are not required to be accounted for in another fund.

The Open Space Fund was created to account for sales tax revenues generated from the Arapahoe County Open Space ballot measure (Resolution No. 030381). The Town receives a shareback of the tax revenues collected. These funds may be used to acquire real property and easements, and to improve, restore and protect open space. The funds may also be used for environmental education programs.

The Colorado Revised Statutes require the establishment of the Conservation Trust Fund if a local government desires to receive state allocations of funds for the acquisition, development and maintenance of park and open space properties. The Colorado Lottery is the primary revenue source of this fund.

The Board of Trustees passed a resolution in 2021 to commit funds for the current and long-term maintenance of the roads. These funds are accounted for in the Road Maintenance Fund.

In 2021, the Town of Foxfield received American Rescue Plan funds from the United States government to help with expenses, and reduced revenues, due to the COVID pandemic. These funds are accounted for in the American Rescue Plan Fund.
